

Workshop on *Drosophila*: An Ideal Model for Research in Biology, for B.Sc. students of Govt. Science College, Hassan.

To provide hands on training and knowledge on using *Drosophila melanogaster* as a model organism for scientific research. The workshop provided introduction to *Drosophila* biology, genetics, breeding culturing techniques, behavioural and neurobiological assays. Hands on experience with *Drosophila* experimentation. Expert lectures, demonstration by resource person, interactive sessions, and group discussions. The *Drosophila* workshop was a successful event that provided valuable training and knowledge. It showcased the versatility and power of *Drosophila* as a model organism and inspired new research idea. The Workshop was organized on 22 & 23 April 2024.Worksshop started with formal inauguration in the gracious presence of Dr.C.K. Renukarya, Director, Dr. S.R. Ramesh, Faculty members and participants from Government Science Colleges, Hassan. The practical workshop was designed to teach and train students the basics of drosophila and how it can be used as a model organism for research. The main purpose of the drosophila workshop is to experience hands-on learning, where students can gain practical experience, understand genetic principles, and use drosophila as an ideal model organism for teaching genetic principles, developmental biology, interdisciplinary learning etc., The workshop provided a fundamental understanding of drosophila and its use in modern biology through daily lectures, followed by demonstration of these techniques through extended laboratory sessions. The program comprised of two theory a session in the Life Sciences auditorium and the practical session in the Drosophila &Neurotoxicology Laboratory.

The workshop coordinators for the session were Dr. Girish Chandran, Coordinator DoS in Biochemistry and Ms Rayana Lavitha D'Silva, Assistant Professor, Pooja Bhagavat Memorial Mahajana Post Graduate Education Centre, PG Wing of SBRR Mahajana First Grade College(A), Mysuru. In the morning session, Dr. Girish Chandran explained the basic morphology and behaviour of drosophila. The principle and procedure were taught and discussed with students. In the afternoon, a practical session was conducted under the guidance of a resource person. Students performed various assays and the results were obtained accordingly. In the practical session, students were taught to prepare the homogenate for the experiments in a stepwise manner and how to use the drosophila larvae in the experiments and interpret the results obtained.

2. Hands-on workshop

Date: 1st & 2nd December 2023

Title: Techniques in Cell Culture

With the global biotechnology industry booming, there is a high demand for cell culture expertise. By training students in cell culture, we will develop a skilled human resource in this area. In addition, cell culture is integral in medical diagnostics, including cancer screening and genetic testing. Training in cell culture will enhance the capacity of local healthcare facilities to offer advanced diagnostic services, leading to improved patient care and disease management. This training provides opportunities for students to learn fundamental techniques and contribute to scientific progress. In this regard the workshop was initiated with the interactive

session by Dr. Mahadesh Prasad, Professor, DOS in Biochemistry on the topic entitled "Cell culture a versatile tool in research" followed by visit to cell culture lab and session on Guidelines, Safety of the lab personnel by S.R. Smitha Grace. Assistant Professor, DOS in Biotechnology, practical sessions started on the first day by Preparation of Media and filter sterilization, inoculation of cell lines followed on second day by trypsinization, Cell counting and Viability measurement and concluded finally by the EB staining. A basic manual on cell culture methods was compiled and issued for the students for their further reference. The students showed enormous interest and involved themselves in learning the techniques and the feedback received by the students and teachers indicates their willingness to collaborate with the team for one such workshop again the upcoming sessions. Title: Techniques For Biochemical Investigations

Biochemical analysis techniques refer to a set of methods, assays, and procedures that enable scientists/researchers to analyze the macromolecules found in living organisms, their chemical composition and their importance in life processes. The most sophisticated of these techniques are reserved for specialty research and diagnostic laboratories. To perform a comprehensive biochemical analysis of a biomolecule in a biological process or system, the biochemist typically needs to design a strategy to detect that biomolecule, isolate it in pure form from among thousands of molecules that can be found in the extracts from a biological sample, characterize it, and analyze its function. An assay, the biochemical test that characterizes a molecule, whether quantitative or semi-quantitative, is important to determine the presence and quantity of a biomolecule in a variety of investigations. Detection assays may range from the simple type of assays done by spectrophotometric measurements and gel staining to determine the concentration and purity of proteins and nucleic acids, to prolonged bioassays that may take days to perform. The interactive session enhanced the knowledge of the students on the availability of a plethora of techniques to be employed in research. The students interacted very well with the resource person and requested the organizers for similar interactive sessions during sessions during their term. The technical sessions of one day symposium was aimed to highlight the emerging trends in life science research that is contributing for the improvement of human health and well-being. The field of life sciences is revolutionizing human health worldwide, ushering in an era of unprecedented possibilities. The world saw the greatest pandemics of modern times and amazing breakthroughs made through technology and remarkable strides made in biological and life science research collectively reshaped the landscape of human health. The symposium included following four technical sessions:

1. Delivering the first technical session Dr. Subramanyam Vemulpad on the topic entitled "Ethical engagement for tapping into indigenous knowledge in the search for Antimicrobials" deliberated on how the traditional knowledge and search of medicinal plants could be the source for developing new antimicrobial agents. He also narrated the instances of how it becomes successful by engaging with the local communities.

2. The second technical session by Dr. K. Kemparaju on "Echis carinatus venom - induced sustained tissue destruction, pathophysiology and strategic remedy", elaborated on the venom Pharmacogenomics and the core of his session was on emerging roles neutrophil extracellular traps, their activation and inhibition in tissue injury and repair processes.

3. The third session by Dr. Bharathi P. Salimath on the topic entitled "Angiogenic Biomarkers in translational research - From Lab to Bed Side" crisply explained how angiogenesis play a critical role in tumor growth and tumor progression. She stressed upon the role of VEGF (vascular endothelial growth factor) and its signaling through its receptors which are of crucial relevance and how the this research on tumor biomarkers can be translated to treatment for the betterment of the mankind.

4. Dr. Komal Kumar deliberating during the fourth technical session on the topic entitled "Blood biomarkers for accurate diagnosis of viral and bacterial infections" explained the role of blood biomarkers to analyze and detect the disease prognosis. Further, he emphasized on how Biomarkers and their impact on precision medicine provides a strategic opportunity for technological developments to improve human health and reduce health-care cost.

These sessions inspired the students of the avenues and the potential areas of applications in Life Sciences how they can orient/re-orient themselves in different fields of Life Sciences in the pursuit of their career/research/employment.

Prof S. R. Ramesh, Chief Scientist and Head, School of Life Sciences, Prof. C. K. Renukarya, Director, PBMMEC, & Dr. Dayananda R.D, Professor, Sri S.B.S Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Mundargi were present during the program with the students and faculties of School of Lifesciences.

The ancient Indian medical system, also known as Ayurveda, is based on ancient writings that rely on a "natural" and holistic approach to physical and mental health. Ayurvedic medicine is one of the world's oldest medical systems and remains one of India's traditional health care systems. Ayurvedic treatment combines products (mainly derived from plants, but may also include animal, metal, and mineral), diet, exercise, and lifestyle. During the lecture Dr. Dayananda R.D inspired the students by explaining the balance of energies known as doshas which os believed to be responsible for health and wellbeing. He explained as defined in Ayurveda, the three doshas relate to the elements of the universe. The Vata dosha is air and space, Kapha dosha is earth and water and the Pitta dosha is fire and water. According to Ayurvedic principles, these doshas are actually responsible for bodily functions, and he mentioned individuals who practice Ayurveda regularly balance their doshas will have a better chance at maintaining their health. 
1. Presentation by Students on World Conservation Day



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
4. Special Guest Lecture & Interactive Session – Entrepreneurship & Intellectual Property Rights



The lecture was denoted with the distribution of biomolecules profile and biological activities to regulate pathogenic organisms and human cancer cells. 


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Department of Social Work

1. Orientation Day Visits - Visit to Old Age Home-Sevayaana

On 28.06.2024, II semester social work students conducted an orientation visit to Sevayana Trust, Old Age Home. The visit aimed to provide students with practical insights into the lives of the elderly, the operations of an old age home, and the various social, emotional, and health challenges faced by senior citizens. Sevayana Trust is a non-profit organisation established in the year 2020. The trust is operational in the area of Mysuru, Karnataka. Elderly care and women's empowerment are two important and interconnected topics that have significant social, economic, and cultural implications and Sevayana works on these aspects.

The orientation visit to the old age home was a valuable learning experience for the social work students. It provided them with firsthand insights into the lives of the elderly and the operations of such facilities. The visit reinforced the importance of empathy, respect, and dedicated care for the elderly and inspired students to contribute meaningfully to this field. The observations and recommendations from this visit will serve as a foundation for future social work interventions and community service initiatives.







2. Orientation Day Visits – Visit to Bharath Cancer Hospital

On 27.06.2024II semester MSW students visited Bharat hospital institute of oncology for an orientation. This visit was organized to provide the students with first hand experience and understanding of the role of social workers in a healthcare setting, particularly in a cancer hospital. The visit aimed to enhance the students' knowledge and prepare them for their future roles in social work within the medical field. The visit highlighted the critical role social workers play in supporting cancer patients and their families. This includes providing emotional support, counselling, facilitating communication between patients and healthcare providers, and helping patients navigate the healthcare system.

The orientation visit to visited Bharat hospital institute of oncology was a valuable learning experience for the social work students. It provided them with a deeper understanding of the healthcare environment and the crucial role social workers play in cancer care. The insights gained from this visit will undoubtedly enhance their ability to provide compassionate and effective support to cancer patients and their families in their future careers.



3. Orientation Day Visits – Visit to District Child Protection Unit On, 27/11/2023 at 2:00 from MSW department we had been to District child protection unit, Sarkari Balakara Mandira which is located in vijayanagar 4th stage, Mysuru. To understand what kind of children are under DCPU, either children conflict with law, child labour, orphans and child abuse and also to observe how physical or emotional care are being provided ,Psychological counseling and other basic materials like food and clothing services. It is a government institution where orphanages and juveniles are taken care it is a institution where only boys under 18 are under district child protection unit. It works to help children adjust to the society. Speaking at the program, Mr. Raghu (program co-coordinator) explained, "Maharashtra government was the first to start a committee based on welfare of children who are forced into child labours child trafficking etc., in the year 1996. Also special juvenile protection officer counselling for family members and children weekly three days: Monday, Wednesday and Friday is available.





4. Orientation Day Visits - Visit to Basavamarga Rehabilitation Centre

On 28/11/23 around 3:00pm from department of social work, we had visited Basavamarga Rehabilitation centre .To know about the organizational and physical setup of the centre. Also to gain knowledge regarding treatment measures to patients with drug addiction. Mr. Manjunath working as counselor of the centre explained that, "They Aim towards providing all addicts so that they can develop their potential to the full. Basavamarga Foundation was registered in 2017 officially. The community has served the society since 1991 and currently manages multiple funds for individual family and foundation donors and local nonprofit. In the last seven years they have been doing charity and de-addiction works in association with other charitable organizations. During its rich history of partnering with donors and the community, the foundation has earned an outstanding reputation for services ,transparency and reliability. Mr. S Basvaraj was the founder and Mr. Prakash Prabhu is the trustee. Dr. Shashank is the psychiatry and Dr. Anand is the physician. There are 140 people who are admitted for 3 months. This is the spiritual programme for the Addicts. All the facilities are provided and there are cocurricular activities so that they can divert their mind and can indulged themselves. Gym facilities are provided and yoga trainer will teach yoga. He continued explaining "During Pandemic the School kids, teenagers were addicted to substances and had more cases compared to the time of pandemic. Counseling and therapies will be provided to the patients. The patients will get withdrawal symptoms after 3-4 hrs. Without medications they depend on 5D's to overcome: Deep breathing, Drinking water, Discuss, Diversion and Decision. They also took all of us to show the surrounding, infrastructure, facilities of the centre and end the session.



5. Blood Donors Day

The department of Social Work had organized blood donation camp on 14.06.2024 in collaboration with KR Hospital Blood Centre to observe World Blood Donor Day. Jeevadhara Foundation, Mandya also joined hands with us and sponsored refreshments for the donors. The event aimed to raise awareness about the importance of blood donation and to encourage students and staff to participate in this life-saving activity. The camp was set up in the PG centre MCA auditorium from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

The camp saw an overwhelming response from students, faculty, and staff. Over 120 individuals registered to donate blood and get tested for anemia. A total of 53 units of blood were collected. And 20 MSW student volunteers assisted in various roles such as registration, guiding donors, and providing refreshments.

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6. Cervical Cancer-

The Department of Social Work, IWC of Mahajana PG centre in collaboration with the Public health research institute, Mysuru had organized an awareness programme on "Understanding cervical cancer and observance of Human Papiloma Virus awareness day" on 04.04.2024 in the PBMMEC campus for the girl students an female staff of the PG centre. The Programme aimed to educate and empower female students about the importance of cervical cancer prevention, early detection, and treatment. Dr. Vijaya Srinivas, Senior clinical research physician, PHRI Mysuru

was the resource person. Topics covered included the causes of cervical cancer, the significance of regular screenings, available vaccination programs, and methods of prevention. Mrs. Poornima Jayakrishna, Administrative officer, PHRI Mysuru and team of PHRI were present in the programme. The response to the Programme was overwhelmingly positive. Beyond knowledge, the programme fostered a sense of community and support among participants, paving the way for ongoing dialogue and solidarity.







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7. Magic Bus Report

The department of Social Work in collaboration with Magic bus foundation organized Community outreach and mobilization programme in the slums of Metagalli, Mysuru. The students assembled near Metagalli bus stop and were given an orientation about the programme. Students were divided in small groups to visit 7 different lower income slum areas of Metagalli. The department had framed a google form to collect data about under graduate women individuals. The agenda was to create awareness about employment opportunities, training and life skill education for women between 18-25 years of age. The students covered lower income areas(slums) of Basavanagudi, Jayadevanagara, kaveri nagara, lokamanya nayaka nagara and B M Sri Nagara. The collected data will be shared to Magic bus foundation who would further conduct training programmes for the willing.



8. Women Health Awareness Programme

The department of Social Work in collaboration with IWC of Mahajana PG centre and Motherhood hospitals had organized a programme for the women staff and students of the PG centre titled "Navigating the Journey through PCOD, PCOS, and Menopause – A Women's Health Awareness Programme". Women's Health Awareness Programme titled "Navigating the Journey through PCOD, PCOS, and Menopause." The programme aimed to empower women with knowledge and tools to better manage and navigate the challenges associated with Polycystic Ovary Syndrome (PCOS), Polycystic Ovarian Disorder (PCOD), and the menopausal transition. Dr. Shwetha Nayak Consultant - Obstetrician & Gynecologist, Gynecology and Laparoscopic Surgery, Motherhood hospital, Mysuru was the resource person along with Dietician Ms. Neethi, Clinical dietician, Motherhood hospital, Mysuru. Dr. Bhavana , Asst Professor and Head of Social Work Department and the co-ordinator of the programme introduced the guests and welcomed the gathering. The session was taken over by Dr. Swetha and Dr. Neethi. The programme ended with a long interaction with the audience.
